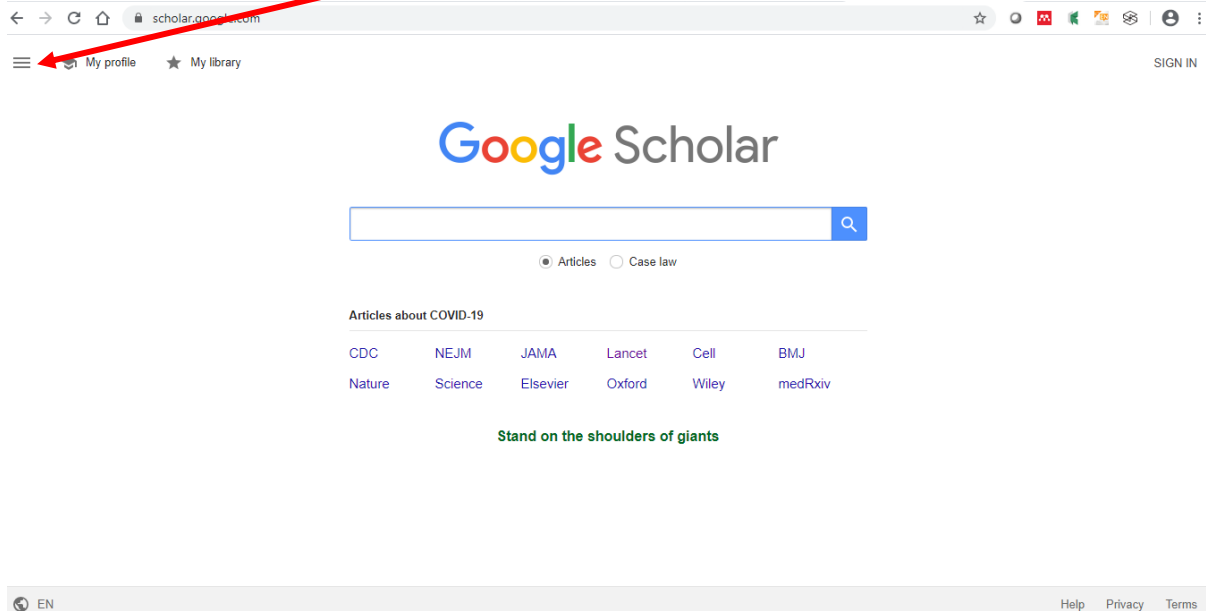
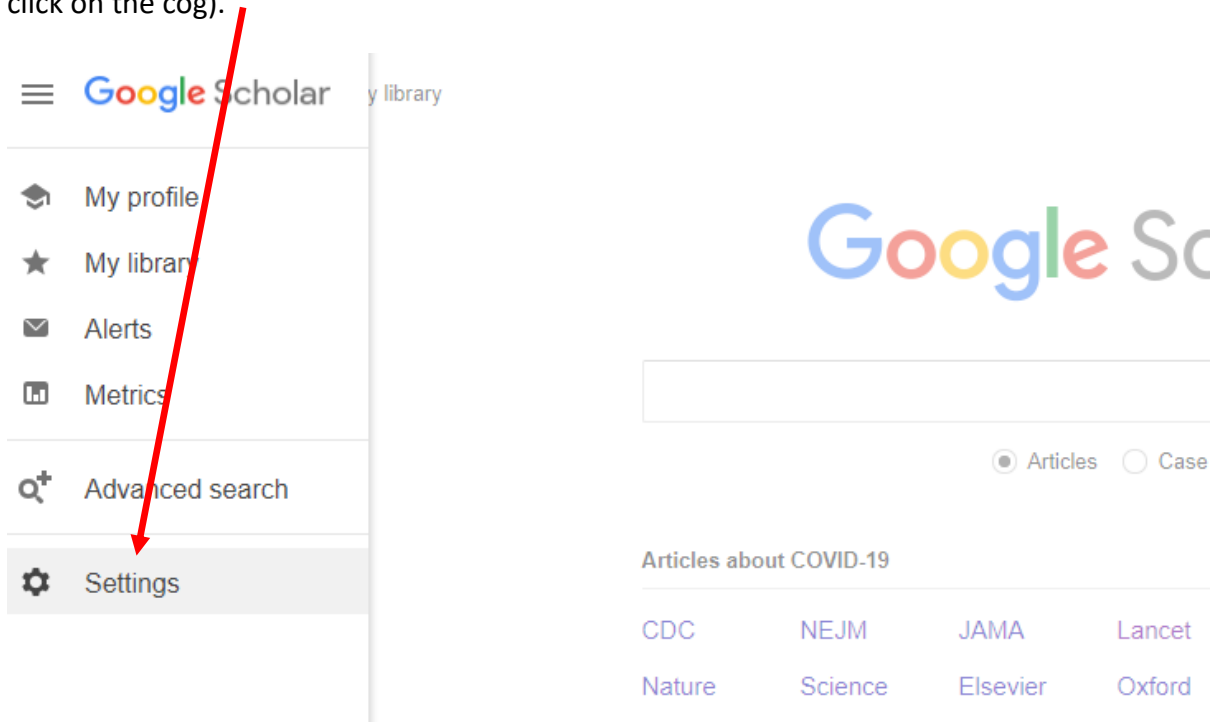


Setting up library links on Google Scholar


From the Google Scholar home page click on the 3 lines in the top left hand corner of the page:



Now click on the 'Settings' (on some computers, there will just be a cog icon, in this case, click on the cog).



Now select 'library links' from the options on the left:


